- The longest waiting times for depression and anxiety treatment with CAMHS in 2022/23 and in 2023 to date and the current waiting times?
- The longest waiting times for autism assessments with CAMHS in 2022/2023 and in 2023 to date, and the current waiting times?
- How many referrals to CAMHS were refused in 2022/23 and in 2023 to date?
- What criteria were used to refuse referrals in 2022/23 and in 2023 to date?
- How many patients were sectioned in 2022/23, and how many have been sectioned in 2023 to date?
