I write further to your request FOI ID 42249 under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 regarding:-

Female Genital Mutilation

Your request is set out below:

1. How many patients have come into your (collective) hospitals with Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) that was noticed and/or attended to, between January 2014-February 2024 calendar years? Please specify if the data is relating to a physical or mental health concern and please make sure to list the physical and mental health concerns separately.

Kent and Medway NHS and Social Care Partnership Trust are a mental health organisation. As a result, physical care elements for a service user would not be routinely collected outside of individual clinical records. The requested information is therefore not held centrally and so cannot be extracted as a standalone piece of data. In order to extract the requested information, and collate the results, it would require a manual exercise to identify and review clinical records and would exceed the appropriate time limits, as per the Freedom of Information Act 2000 section 12(1) which does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

2. Between January 2014 to February 2024: how much has the trust spent (or how much has it cost) for the following things relating to FGM:

2a) corrective FGM (whatever actions need to be taken to correct or improve the damage caused by FGM)

2b) surgery

2d) appointments for mental health – counselling, therapy, group therapy etc. This includes secondary treatment for mental health, as I appreciate acute trusts would look after primary physical care.
