## **Request for Information**

I write further to your request FOI ID 51801 under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 regarding: -

Admissions where exposure to air pollution is a contributing factor

Your request is set out below:

- 1. The number of times a patient was admitted where exposure to air pollution (International Classification of Diseases, tenth revision (ICD-10) code Z581)\* was recorded as a contributing factor to
  - (\* I understand this is the code used by NHS trusts to log exposure to air pollution, but if your trust uses a different code or some other system, please still provide the relevant data)
  - a. If possible, please tell me what the primary diagnosis was for each of these admissions. (For clarity, I want to know total numbers admitted with each primary diagnosis — for example, if 45 people were admitted with a primary diagnosis of asthma where exposure to air pollution was identified as a contributing factor.)
- 2. Please tell me how many of the patients in question 1 subsequently died in hospital.

Please be advised the Kent and Medway NHS and Social Care Partnership are a mental health organisation. As a result, we would not hold the information requested and can not assist in your request.
